My Trip to Europe –Kristy Sparkes!

Where to start? Well I planned my trip about 3 months before departure, I mean really, why take longer than that? Lol. I have a friend who lives in Denmark and I thought that it was the perfect excuse for a holiday. I asked permission and kindly enough, she offered me accommodation at her place and decided to tour some of Europe with me for 2 weeks so plans were set! I booked my flights for the 21st of June to fly out 3.5 weeks later on the 14th of July. Frankly I was shitting myself as I was going on my own initially and I still had to occupy myself for 1.5 weeks before going home!

Well the day came and I waved off my family and prepared for the 24 hours in transit with Thai airways. OMG was it a long flight. Bangkok airport was quite amazing and damn hot and humid! Thank god I was outta there quick! Then arrive Copenhagen airport to see my friend Mette-Marie. We went back to her apartment and later out to see her horse. She has a Shagya Arab mare called Reenta. I learnt that it is illegal to trim or shoe your own horses here, that'd put me outta business! I also met the wonderful Icelandic Horses. They are a bit like overgrown Shetlands with loads of mane but more about them later. The countryside here is so green and lush and there are loads of trails to ride on. During my stay on our days where we were at home we borrowed an Icelandic horse for me and did some riding. The Icelandic horse has 5 gaits, walk, trot, tolt, canter and pace and of course gallop. There are loads of variations of each gait because the horse is capable of combining them. The tolt is my favourite and is like an incredibly fast walk. It was so smooth you could drink a wine and never spill a drop!

After perusing Copenhagen a bit Mette-Marie and I caught a flight to Stockholm. We stayed in a gorgeous area called Gamla Stan and I must say that this was the most beautiful place we went. We walked and walked until we had seen every little street as all of them were full of character. The buildings were from the old times of fishing and piers so all streets (pretty much) led to the water. I had my first experiences with the Royal Guard here. Scandinavian people pride themselves on their Royal heritage and everything is the Royal this and that. The palaces were huge! If one wasn't big enough, bugger it, build another! Anyway I got a little cheeky and went marching when they did their Royal changing of the guards. Had a good laugh! We sailed down to the Archipelago which were hundreds of tiny Islands, very beautiful, though the weather was a little sad looking.

After SAS airlines went on strike we caught a train to Oslo. What a crappy city! I saw more drugs here than in Amsterdam, people shooting up in the streets, not nice. Once again we saw the Royal Palace, damn big again! We up to Holmen-

collen which was where they did the Olympic ski jumping competition. Very impressive, even without snow! But what I was really looking forward to was the cruise back to Copenhagen down the Norwegian Fjords! It was so beautiful, sitting in the spa on the back deck, beverage in hand, watching the scenery go by. The weather was still pretty miserable but who cares, right?!

Back in Denmark we did more horse riding and then went to Romo Island. What a highlight this place is! It's on the far west of Denmark and backs onto the Wadden sea which is the only place in the world (apparently) where the tide rises and falls twice a day! We had 3 days booked here to tour the area on Icelandic Horses. Our first ride we were up at 5am in order to get the horses on the truck and to Mando Island while the tide was down as this Island is inaccessible during high tide. Then we had 3.5 glorious hours to ride around what is Denmark's largest desert which is usually underwater. 25kms of riding on sand, gee it was fun! Most of the ride was doing the tolt (fast walk thingy) and these guys really do go fast! The ride is not for the faint hearted and when you're not tolt you are galloping flat out until the horse got tired. We saw sea lions and crossed tidal creeks and then had to get our butts back quick before high tide. What a laugh! The second ride the following day was a little more sedate but I got the guide's horse from the day before which was a little pocket rocket! Because of that I was the lead horse and was allowed to lead us in the gallops etc. This horse apparently has one of the fastest tolt and I laughed my head off as he tolted and I'm cruising along going laa di daaa and everyone else had to keep up in a strong canter!! What fun!!!! Our last day in Romo included a massage from a German Helga lady, no privacy here! Basically you rock up in a

In gleeful anticipation I sprinted over to the other arena to perhaps add a few instructions of my own but was struck dumb on arrival not only by the impressive manoeuvres taking place on the arena but by Stacey's never seen before at a rally co-ordinated outfit. Brenda did point out the horse's boots weren't the same colour as the saddle blanket so we couldn't get too excited.

The highlight of the second jump with Georgina, Peter, Drew and Marg was seeing Bourbon off load George. He's a naughty old nag and obviously feeling good but there'll be no more oats for him. Drew let the team down by not providing any entertainment, Peter on Sammy – shorten you rein and Finnegan found the accelerator cause Marg found the spires.

The third jumping lesson proved to be very eventful with Karen Mac 2 on her new horse wanting to show Georgina what a REAL buck looked like and what a BIG movement her horse had. The peanut gallery was immediately on the scene to pick her up after she'd slammed into the ground. 


